QUESTIONS OF LAW TO BE REFERRED TO THE CONSTITUTION BENCH

1. Whether the expression of a bona fide opinion about the extent of corruption in any section of the judiciary would amount to contempt of Court?
2. If the answer to question 2 is in the affirmative, whether the person who expresses such opinion about the extent of corruption in a section of judiciary is obliged to prove that his opinion is correct or whether it is enough to show that he bonafide held that opinion?
